



Lincoln Law School of Sacramento Pathway to Law Program

- 1. Pathway to Law students will have the ability to identify themselves as such on the Lincoln Law School application forms.**
- 2. Pathway to Law students will not pay an application fee.**
- 3. Lincoln Law School's dean will conduct personal admission interviews of all Pathway applicants.**
- 4. The Lincoln Law School admissions committee will review all Pathway applicants with a holistic view.**
- 5. All Pathway students will be invited to sit in on law school classes.**
- 6. Lincoln Law School of Sacramento will consider for admission Pathway applicants who have a minimum of an AA or AS degree.**
- 7. Admission to Lincoln Law School is guaranteed to all Pathway applicants who have earned a 3.0 or higher in their college work and who have earned an LSAT score of 25% or higher.**
- 8. A \$1,000 1L scholarship will be awarded to all Pathway applicants who are accepted and who attend Lincoln Law School.**
- 9. Current [tuition and fees](#) are located on the school's website.**
- 10. Lincoln Law School will maintain statistical data for all admitted Pathway students and communicate that data to the Cal-LAW executive director within the restrictions of state and federal laws.**
- 11. Lincoln Law School will communicate with the community colleges and 4-year undergraduate institutions to involve Pathway students in activities and programs sponsored at the law school such as lectures, pre-law training programs, law firm receptions, judges' nights, moot court, volunteer opportunities to serve as mock jurors or organize law firm interview programs, and bar related activities.**
- 12. Representatives from Lincoln Law School will attend annual summit conferences to meet with regional partners to offer insights on law school teaching and courses, career advising, and financial aid.**
- 13. Lincoln Law School will support the Pathway program by providing students, pre-law advisors, and other educational and career counselors with accurate and important information about law school opportunities. This includes conducting and supporting collaborative outreach activities at the participating community colleges and undergraduate institutions.**
